## \* LENT COURSE

This year is the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Council of Nicaea at which the Nicene Creed, which we usually say at the Sunday morning Eucharist, was agreed for use by the Church. The Apostles' Creed, usually said at Evensong, had already begun to be formed by the time the Council met and undoubtedly influenced the Church's profession of faith. During Evensongs in Lent we are examining our understanding of the Apostles' Creed. As it is permitted to use the Apostles' Creed at the Eucharist as well, during Lent we are replacing the Nicene Creed with the Apostles' Creed on Sundays at 10.30am and hope this might whet the appetite to come to Evensong to consider the meaning of what we are saying.

# ROOTED IN FAITH, REACHING OUT IN LOVE - REALISING OUR VISION

To bring St Mary's Vision2030 to life, we need to take a vital first step: increasing our planned financial giving by £30,000 annually.

As I prayerfully reflect on 2 Corinthians 9:7-8, I am reminded that giving is an act of faith and joy, "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

Many assume the King Henry VIII Endowed Trust fully funds our church, but it doesn't. Giving at St Mary's has been declining, likely due to this misconception and the pandemic. To move forward, we must act together.

#### A Call to Renew Our Commitment

This Lent we are running a Stewardship Campaign. A strong response will allow us to step forward with confidence, and we'll benefit from the King Henry Trust matching our increased giving. Without a strong response, we'll need to reevaluate our mission plans.

We're asking everyone to renew their commitment to St Mary's by:

Reviewing their financial giving or tithing and switching to the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) by Friday 18<sup>th</sup> April

I know some are financially stretched, and I simply ask that we all contribute as best we can, prioritising St Mary's ministry in our giving. Your generosity is essential to fulfilling our vision. Let's step forward in faith, together. Fr Angus
