David Thomas, whose 35-year career as an organist, conductor, singer and teacher has taken him from Oxford to Shrewsbury via Canterbury, Edinburgh, Reigate, London and Winchester, will be giving the first organ recital of the summer series on Friday 16th May. His century-spanning programme includes music by Bach, Howells, Karg-Elert, Rawsthorne and Scheidt, as well as Rachmaninoff's famous Prelude in C sharp minor in a transcription for organ by Vierne.
