PRAYER FOR THE CMM SISTERS

DIRECT GIVING

As most of you will be aware, we have recently run a Stewardship campaign which asked people to review their level of giving and to do so through the Parish Giving Scheme. The response was fantastic.

The Parish Giving Scheme collects individual donations and remits them to the Church monthly in one payment. (I can confirm that the system is operating well and that all donations are received by the Church.)

Importantly, the scheme also takes care of administering Gift Aid and each month we receive a second remittance for all those people that have registered for Gift Aid. This significantly reduces the workload on our administrative staff who used to have to do this manually.

A small number of donors have not yet moved over to the new system and continue to donate directly to the Church. It would be extremely helpful if those people could move across to the new system which will avoid the need for the team to submit Gift Aid claims manually. (Parish Giving Scheme forms are available from the office and I will ask for a supply to be available from the visitors desk at the back of the Church.)

But most importantly, please don't stop giving as your donations are enabling the Church to deliver its ministry as well as place us on a better financial footing following the demands of the Tower repair! Thank you. *Chris Spencer (Treasurer)*

MUSICAL MATTERS

We are very pleased to celebrate the gifts of the Spirit in the form of installing new Head and Deputy Head Boy Choristers - George Webster and Robin Sjurseth respectively - during the Eucharist on Pentecost, and awarding a tranche of Royal School of Church Music 'Voice for Life' medals and certificates.

As one of the major liturgical feasts, the music the Choir will sing on Pentecost is especially glorious. The motet at the Eucharist is Tallis' *Loquebantur variis linguis* which, written in seven parts, reflects the many languages heard in Jerusalem, and at Evensong the Choir will sing William Walton's epic *The Twelve*, a large-scale and thrilling setting of text by Auden.

UPDATE ON VISION2030 - ROOTED IN FAITH, REACHING OUT IN LOVE

In Autumn 2024, we invited our community to share their vision for St Mary's future. With 97 participants and 600+ feedback responses, Vision2030 was shaped. Significant progress is being made across the four key areas of our mission action plan:

<u>Faith</u>: From welcoming new clergy to expanding Sunday School, serving team and choir we have a strong focus at present on our Sunday worship alongside our online Bible study, weekday services, we're looking to deepen our spiritual life and grow in numbers.

<u>Community</u>: On top of the many excellent existing initiatives such as the Christmas tree festival, we are looking to strengthen our local ties through initiatives like Singing for Mums, after-school clubs, and partnerships with Warwick Castle and local charities. Our nave is alive with events and our doors remain open to the community.

<u>World</u>: As a cornerstone church for the Global Centre for Peace and Business, we're exploring ways to play our part in supporting a more just and peaceful world, with plans for a peace festival next year.

<u>Stewardship</u>: With a 150% increase in planned giving including gift aid, we're working on restoring our historic building and improving visitor experiences, alongside expanding our staff and volunteer teams.

FOODBANK

Thank you so much for the ongoing donations for the Packmores Estate Food Pantry. Please do note there is now a blackboard up by the hamper at the back of church, indicating what is requested and will be amended as needs change. As well as the normal non-perishable goods usually sought, this week they have particularly asked for cat and dog food, any tinned vegetables (but particularly peas, chickpeas and tomatoes) and rice. I have noticed that cat food is particularly prized. If anyone feels able to add some to their trolley while buying their own groceries that would be amazing!

If anyone has any particularly good recipes which can be put together using simple, store cupboard ingredients, please do speak to Suzette, who is hoping to put together a St Mary's/Food Pantry recipe collection.

CORE SUCCESS - AFTER SCHOOL SUPPORT CLUB

Thank you so much to those members of the congregation who have volunteered to help with the after school literacy and numeracy support club St Mary's is running, along with the Packmores Community Centre and the Warwick Schools Foundation, each Tuesday afternoon in term time. This is now up and running and has been received enthusiastically by the children. This is a pilot term and we hope to offer the scheme to more schools in September. Please note that is run from the Packmores Community Centre on Lyttleton Road, although volunteers are asked to arrive at the St Mary Immaculate Primary School (not church) at 3:20 to assist in walking the children over.

SINGING FOR MUMS

Each Wednesday in term time, St Mary's, in conjunction with Warwick a Singing Town, offers a weekly free singing group, Singing for Mums, aimed at mothers with newish babies, to promote emotional and mental wellbeing, 10-11:30. It is a really lovely session; if you know anyone you feel would enjoy it please do spread the word! We are looking to run family sessions, where we particularly welcome fathers and grandfathers, into the summer holidays, but intend to keep term-time for mothers especially but also grandmothers and female carers.
