Ministry of the Word

Genesis 17: 1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will

establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you. God said to Abraham, 'As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.'

Jesus began to teach his disciples that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.' He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their

life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

AGAPE

Officiant In our Agape Meal, as we approach Lent, we journey towards Calvary and the cross, walking with Jesus and his disciples.

Therefore we acknowledge these symbols to remind us of Christ's promises to us:

A candle, to remind us of the description of Christ in John's Gospel: 'What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.'
(John 1: 4-5)

Some food to remind us of Jesus words on the road to Jerusalem: "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it." (Mark 8: 34-35)

A cup of wine or grape juice to remind us of Jesus words to his disciples in the Upper Room: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me, and I in them, bear much fruit". (John 15: 5)

Let us pray:

Living and Risen Christ, we welcome your presence with us. May the food, drink and companionship we share nourish our bodies, hearts and minds. And may our spirits be refreshed. As we live in the light of your presence with us now, and at all times and places.

Sharing of Food and Drink

A portion of our food is eaten, followed by the sharing of the cup. If there are others present in your 'bubble' they can be passed from person to person, during which we hear 'Wash me thoroughly' (Words: Psalm 51:2-3; Music: Samuel Sebastian Wesley) A new recording by St Mary's choirs, recorded separately in lockdown and edited together to make a virtual performance.
