*The bread or a (non-tactile) blessing is offered from in front of the Nave altar. Please stand as directed by our sides-people, in a socially-distanced way and wear a mask as you receive your wafer. Worshippers are most welcome to receive in one kind but if you would like to sip wine from a common cup it is offered to either side. Please **do not intinct** your wafer as per Church of England guidance.*

During the Distribution the Choir sings the AGNUS DEI from Messe Solenelle by Langlais and THE GATEWAY OF HEAVEN (Words: from Genesis, John, 2 Corinthians; Music: Paul Trepte (b.1954)).
