LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: James 3: 13-4: 3, 7-8a

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

And put your trust in him?

And promise to follow him for ever?

And promise to follow him for ever.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The president makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Evelyn:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

The president invites parents and godparents to sign the child with the cross. When all have signed, the president says

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

Stand bravely with him, oppose the power of evil, and remain his faithful disciple to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

The baptismal party move to the font for the prayer of blessing over the water

Loving Father,

we thank you for your servant Moses

who led your people through the waters of the Red Sea

to freedom in the Promised Land.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The president addresses the congregation

Let us affirm, together with Evelyn's parents and godparents, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

BAPTISM

The president pours water on the child saying:

Evelyn Lucy, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The child is anointed with oil and the president says

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

Amen.

GIVING OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

The president gives the newly baptized a lighted candle.

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light. You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Evelyn and her parents return to the Nave altar as her godparents return to their seats.

WELCOME AND PEACE

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome this child and uphold Evelyn in her new life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism:

Evelyn, by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith;

we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

This is the current Church of England guidance.


