LITURGY OF THE WORD

The congregation sits

FIRST READING: *Hebrews 5: 1-10*

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as

Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; as he says also in another place, 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.' In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

GOSPEL READING: *Mark 10: 35-45*

At the beginning

Reader Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

All say **Glory to you, O Lord.**

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know

what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.' When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

We present to you Edward Alexander Moritz, as a candidate for baptism

The president then says to the parents and godparents

Parents and godparents, you have brought this child to baptism and speak for him today. As we trust God for his growth in faith, will you promise to care for him, pray for him, and help him to follow Christ?

We will.

DECISION

The president addresses the parents and godparents

In baptism God calls us to new life.

We die with Christ to all that destroys, and rise to live with him for ever.

Therefore I ask the parents and godparents:

Do you reject evil?

I reject evil.

And all its many forms?

And all its many forms.

And all its empty promises?

And all its empty promises.

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

And put your trust in him?

And put my trust in him.

And promise to follow him for ever?

And promise to follow him for ever.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The president makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the child:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

The president invites parents and godparents to sign the child with the cross.

When all have signed, the president says

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

**Stand bravely with him,
oppose the power of evil,
and remain his faithful disciple to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

Amen.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

The baptismal party move to the font for the prayer of blessing over the water

Loving Father,

we thank you for your servant Moses

who led your people through the waters of the Red Sea
to freedom in the Promised Land.

We thank you for your Son Jesus,

who has rescued us from the deep waters of sin and
shown us the way of salvation.

Now send your Spirit upon this water,

that those who are washed in it

may share Christ's death and resurrection,

and find true freedom as your children,

risen with Christ for ever.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The president addresses the congregation

Let us affirm, together with the parents and godparents,
our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe in God the Father,
source of all being and life,
the one for whom we exist?
I believe and trust in him.

who took our human nature,
died for us and rose again?
I believe and trust in him.

BAPTISM

The president pours water on the child saying:

Edward Alexander Moritz, I baptize you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

The child is anointed with oil and the president says

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,
pour upon you the riches of his grace,
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.
Amen.

GIVING OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

The president gives the newly baptized a lighted candle.

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness
and has given us a place with the saints in light.
You have received the light of Christ;
walk in this light all the days of your life.
Shine as a light in the world
to the glory of God the Father.

Edward and his parents return to the Nave altar as his godparents return to their seats.

WELCOME

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome this child and uphold Edward in his new life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism:

Edward, by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith;

we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

President The Lord is here.

This is the current Church of England guidance.*
