The bread or a (non-tactile) blessing is offered from in front of the Nave altar. Please stand as directed by our sides-people, and wait in a socially-distanced way to receive your wafer. Worshippers are most welcome to receive in one kind but if you would like to sip wine from a common cup it is offered to either side. Please **do not intinct** your wafer. This is the current Church of England guidance.
