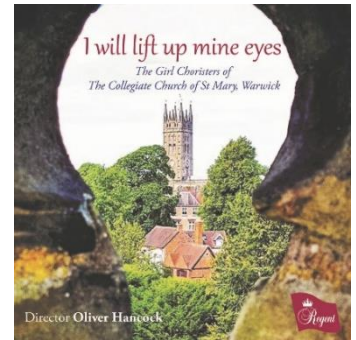

ST MARY'S DEFIBRILLATOR

You may have noticed the new St Mary's defibrillator at the back of the church. Local business, Peach Pubs, who own and run The Rose and Crown pub on the Market Place, have very kindly funded the purchase of the internal defibrillator for us from their Community Fund. This is fantastic as the closest external defibrillator was situated on Shire Hall on the Market Place. In an emergency the defibrillator can be accessed by pushing the glass on the cupboard and opening the door to the equipment. No training is required to use the equipment as the machine talks the user and 999 operatives will also talk people through how to use. Many thanks to Peach Pubs for their generosity and to Kate Rist (our Events Lead) for finding this funding for us.

LET THE ROARING ORGAN BLOW - TWICE!

Our next two lunchtime recitals bring St Mary's organ back into play after a longer than usual hiatus in the series! The recital on Friday 14th June, will be the last given in our series by Colin Millington before he leaves the post of Organ Scholar at St Mary's. He'll be finishing on a bold note indeed, presenting Vierne's kaleidoscopic and compelling Third Symphonie. Then, on Friday 21st June, we will be welcoming Pavlos Triantaris, a Greek organist currently based in the UK where he serves as organist at the Traditional Church of St Alban and St Henry VI in Letchworth. His programme combines old favourites from the pens of Bach, Vierne and Whitlock with less familiar - but no less enjoyable - music by Busbetsky and Tinel. Both performances start at 1.15pm and entry is free with a retiring collection.

COLLEGIUM WARWICK CONCERT: 22nd JUNE

All are warmly invited to Collegium Warwick's summer concert at 7.30pm on Saturday 22nd June, when they'll be joined by the Beauchamp Quartet. The choir will sing Haydn's *Seven Last Words from the Cross*, Vivaldi's *Credo in E minor*, and *Cantique de Jean Racine* by Gabriel Fauré. Tickets are £15 for adults (accompanied under-16s are free of charge) and are available from members of Collegium, St Mary's Shop and on the door.

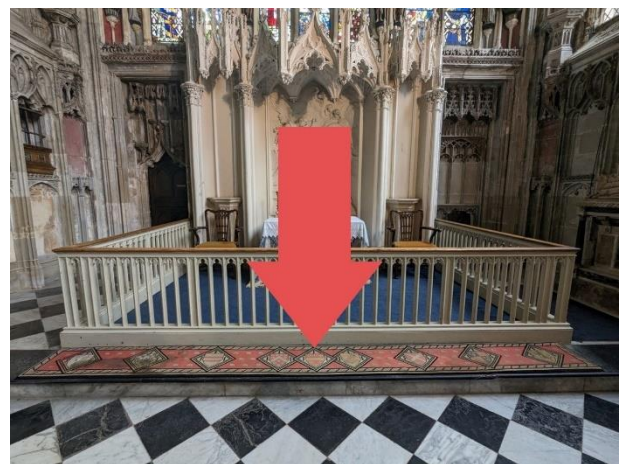
BEAUCHAMP CHAPEL KNEELER COMPETITION

Regular readers and followers of the Choir's activities will know that the choristers and Gentlemen spend a week 'in residence' at a cathedral most summers. In recent years, the Choir has visited Lincoln, Bristol, and Canterbury Cathedrals, with last year's tour transplanted to Normandy. In August this year, the boy choristers and Gentlemen will be spending a week at Ripon Cathedral, singing daily services, enjoying various trips and excursions, and doing lots and lots of singing. These weeks are hugely beneficial, as they amount to roughly ten weeks of our normal choral schedule. LIVESTREAMING - help us to connect with our online congregation

We provide a live-stream of our 10.30am Sunday service on Facebook and YouTube. The 10.30am order of service, weekly newsletter, monthly prayer diary and parish magazine can also be viewed and downloaded from our website. Please note that for our 10.30am service the South side of St Mary's (by the font) is a zone for those who wish to maintain social distance or avoid the cameras from our live-streaming. In other parts of the Church every attempt is made not to show faces but this can happen if people turn around during the service. The congregation is not filmed whilst receiving communion.

LIVESTREAM TEAM - ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Livestreaming is an important part of our outreach. On average there are 15-30 "live" viewers on a Sunday across both YouTube and Facebook, with typically a further 50 viewers choosing to watch all or part of the service later in the week. In 2023 on YouTube we had 11,500 views. If we are to continue to offer this outreach every week, we urgently need additional volunteers. The time commitment is minimal; no technical knowledge is required; training will be given; you will work with an experienced member of the team. GDPR

Under GDPR, St Mary's must have consent of anyone whose image might be included in our broadcast. Every attempt is made not to show faces but this can happen if people turn around during the service. The congregation is not filmed whilst receiving communion, and side aisles and the back third of the centre of the church are not covered by our cameras.
