ON TOUR FROM AUSTRIA

On Friday 4th July, we welcome our second European guest organist: Stefan Donner, based in Vienna and enjoying a globe-spanning career as an organist and teacher. His programme offers a varied survey of 20th century music for the organ, much of it by living composers: Paul Hertel, Maximilian Kreuz, Peter Planyavsky and Wolfram Wagner, with works by older masters Bach and Duruflé for a more familiar flavour. Starting at 1.15pm, the performance is free to attend with a retiring collection.

FOODBANK

Thank you so much for the ongoing donations for the Packmores Estate Food Pantry. Please do note there is now a blackboard up by the hamper at the back of church, indicating what is requested and will be amended as needs change. As well as the normal non-perishable goods usually sought, this week they have particularly asked for cat and dog food, any tinned vegetables (but particularly peas, chickpeas and tomatoes) and rice. I have noticed that cat food is particularly prized. If anyone feels able to add some to their trolley while buying their own groceries that would be amazing!
