Westminster government has reached Step 4 of its roadmap to move England out of its latest lockdown. This final phase removes all legal restrictions previously in place. Nevertheless we are proceeding cautiously with the reopening of St Mary's. During August we will continue with a weekly 10.30am



Sunday service, which is also live-streamed on Facebook and then uploaded to YouTube.



We are following the guidance of the Church of England and other organizations. Therefore we are recommending the continued use of masks and hand sanitiser in our building. We have zones on the south and north side of church which are kept for those who also wish to maintain social distancing.

Orders of service, our news sheet, prayer diary and parish magazine, can still be viewed and downloaded from our website. Holy Communion is offered in two kinds (bread and wine) but it is perfectly acceptable to continue to receive in one kind only.

SUNDAY WORSHIP IN CHURCH

Just a reminder that during the August summer season we are continuing to hold a service on Sunday mornings with the hope that we can return to something more like normal in September. We're also continuing to recommend that worshippers wear masks for all services, use hand sanitizer on coming into church and maintain sensible social distancing. In addition, we have a zoning system in place so that those

who wish to ensure they are keeping to the Step 3 procedures can sit on the south and north aisles of St Mary's, whilst the centre part of the nave are presently more flexible.

SUNDAY COMMUNION IN CHURCH: Today's Sunday Worship is a service of Holy Communion, which will be the first under the lifting of England's COVID restrictions. This means we are offering communion in the following ways: (a) one kind (wafer); or (b) two kinds (wafer and wine); or (c) as a non-tactile blessing. For those sitting in the central two sections of the nave, if you would like to receive any of these then please queue down the central aisle in a socially distanced way, as directed by our sidespeople. The priest will drop a wafer in your hand or administer a blessing and members of our serving team will have chalices at either end of the communion rail. Please do not kneel at the rail and only sip from the chalice — do not intinct your wafer. This is the current Church of England guidance.

<u>SUMMARY OF ADVICE</u>: St Mary's is following the Church of England's advice carefully, in particular the practical steps outlined in its detailed guidance:

- i) Continuing with online worship provision, in addition to in-person services.
- ii) Continuing to provide alternative means of accessing orders of service for those who may still feel unsure about using shared materials.
- iii) Introducing 'Zoning' spaces for services in our nave. For those who wish to continue to socially distance we are setting aside the seating on the south and north side. Masks must also be worn in these areas.
- iv) Continuing to provide hand sanitiser at entrances and key points.
- v) We will be cautiously re-introducing some other aspects of our worship. For instance, last Sunday we sang a congregational hymn for the first time and this Sunday we have two hymns. Having said that, we will continue our aim of keeping worship in church on the shorter side as an ongoing COVID precaution.

WHAT WILL BE HAPPENING AT ST MARY'S? We are looking at how we can safely restore more of our regular services from the start of September and further details will be made available through our

newsletter and online in the coming weeks. We need to bear in mind that as we move into this stage, we'll be reliant on the good will and hard work of our dedicated volunteers. COVID 19 has had a major impact on church finances so our worship verging team are working on an unpaid basis. We are presently unable to re-open our

shop and although we're re-opening for visitors that's only for this summer period.

<u>TOWER UPDATE</u>: The first phase of the tower project - protective scaffolding on the lower half of the tower - has moved a big step closer, with public notice of the planned road closures. Our Operations Manager has been working with the County, District and Town Councils, as well as the Chamber of Trade and CJ's Events, to ensure that disruption to the town centre will be kept to the minimum possible, and is pleased to report that all of the stakeholders have been extremely supportive. The work will start no earlier than mid-August (date TBC). For more information, see our website. The OM will communicate more about access to the church as the date approaches.


