WELCOME TO OUR WEEKLY NEWSLETTER. St Mary's has begun to cautiously reopen following the pandemic lockdown. At present this includes socially-distanced private prayer on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 1-3pm; and Sunday Worship at 10.30am.

Our Sunday service is a simple liturgy with prayers, readings, pre-recorded music and a sermon which is based around the Church of England's *Daily Prayer* and lasts about 30 minutes. We aim to live stream it on *Facebook* and upload it to our *YouTube* channel afterwards. Please note that singing remains prohibited at the moment, as does serving coffee after our worship. We are also required to record worshippers' and a phone number for tracking and tracing purposes.



St Mary's continues to produce our news sheet, prayer diary and parish magazine which can be viewed and downloaded from our website. The church office is working from home at present and can be contacted through the details at the end of the newsletter or online.


PLACE I BELONG

of August so please be patient as we seek to ensure that we can continue to transmit and record our Sunday Worship.








THE FINAL FRAME

A discussion of *Leading by Story* appeared in the journal *Holiness* and has recently been put online here:


