#### FEELING THE HEAT

As the serious nature of the new COVID variants becomes ever more apparent we are continuing with our Sunday Worship Agape Service which is available online. In addition, this Monday sees the start of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which was due to conclude with the unity service in St Mary's next Sunday. #### **CAMPAIGN 2023 LAUNCHED**

A campaign has been launched to raise £3million to safeguard the future of



St Mary's ahead of its 900th anniversary in 2023. Campaign 2023 aims to raise £2million to fund urgent repairs to the landmark tower to avoid its closure, and a further £1million to build an endowment fund to ensure the fabric, music and ministry of St Mary's for the next millennium. #### FABRIC UPDATE

Despite the cold weather, work has continued apace on the roofs of the north entrance and chapter house. Investigations have revealed major

issues with the construction of the roof above the song school stairs leading to significant problems with condensation. The roof now has to be removed and reconstructed at an additional cost of £36,000, taking the project cost to a total of over £170,000. Thankfully, we are highly optimistic of an extension to our existing Culture Recovery Fund Major Works Fund grant to cover 80% of the total. We are obliged to fund the remaining 20%.



Our Operations Manager has been in frequent contact with the Cathedral and Church Buildings Division of the CofE about the grant, and is immensely grateful for their administrative support.

The erection of the tower scaffolding is still awaiting clearance from Warwickshire County Council regarding road closures, an issue which is proving to be hard to resolve, given the narrowness of the road and Warwick's convoluted one-way systems. In the meantime, the Public Notice of the restoration work on the tower has been published - a legal requirement before the Chancellor of the diocese may grant the faculty to allow the works to take place. #### **FAIR TAX SEMINAR**

It is organised by The Justice & Peace Group of Warwick Roman Catholics (St Mary Immaculate & St Charles Borromeo), along with the Elders of Warwick Quakers.

With an estimated £7bn of corporation tax receipts still going astray as a result of profit shifting alone, this session will explore how we can stand up for fair tax conduct. Over 60 UK businesses and 9 local councils support this growing movement. Mary Patel, Networks Manager at Fair Tax Mark, will outline the current situation and show how we in Warwick, or elsewhere, can have a meaningful influence.
