WELCOME TO OUR WEEKLY NEWSLETTER. The Westminster government has removed all legal COVID restrictions previously in place, but nevertheless we are proceeding cautiously with the reopening of St Mary's. During September we are cautiously restarting some of our regular services, including our full choral services, whilst continuing to live-stream our 10.30am Sunday service on Facebook and YouTube.





We are following the guidance of the Church of England and other organisations, therefore we are recommending the continued use of masks and hand sanitiser in our building. We have zones on the south and north side of church which are kept for those who also wish to maintain social distancing.

The current order of service, newsletter, prayer diary and parish magazine can still be viewed and downloaded from our website. Holy Communion is offered in two kinds (bread and wine) but it is perfectly acceptable to continue to receive in one kind only.







VISITOR OPENING: With the fall-off in tourist trade as autumn draws in, we will no longer be able to open the church to visitors. The current pattern of opening Thursday to Sunday afternoons will continue until 26th September, so if you have yet to take a tour around the church do take advantage of the opportunity. Our visitor team and a guide are always on hand to answer any questions you may have.



TOWER UPDATE: Work is continuing apace on the protective scaffolding around the lower half of the tower and is on schedule to finish in early October. We apologise that, apart from the Sunday 10.30am and 5.30pm services, we cannot arrange for mobility-impaired access through the construction site. On completion of this phase of the scaffolding, the road closures and construction site will be removed, and we will once again be able to use the west end doors for pedestrian access. This state of affairs will remain until we have raised the £1.5million necessary to proceed with the rest of the scaffolding (which will take another 7 weeks, with attendant road closures) and then the actual restoration work (9-10 months without road closures).

CAMPAIGN 2023 UPDATE Over the last few weeks we have welcomed 120






KINGDOM STORIES
