LOCAL ADVICE FOR PLACES OF WORSHIP

We are keeping a close eye on guidelines and recommendations, and this week our Operations Manager attended a COVID Secure - Places of Worship information webinar hosted by the County Council. The panel included local authority staff from public health, trading standards, Warwickshire Police, Fire and Rescue and the Towns Team. The council is extremely concerned about the new variants and offered the following advice for Places of Worship whenever they are ready to open.

- Places of Worship should be led by the guidelines but not compelled by them each should operate within limits of risk with which they are comfortable.
- Social distancing is of paramount importance, and because of the transmissibility of the new variants and the data on their spread in Warwickshire, WCC is recommending 3m distancing wherever possible, with an absolute minimum of 2m.



- Places of Worship have responsibility for ensuring that worshippers are kept safe and maintain their distance. Inside the building, distance has to be maintained when entering and leaving as well as during the worship itself. Outside, we have to ensure that our worshippers are not seen "to gather". This requires us to control queuing prior to entry and also ensure that our worshippers disperse rapidly after services.
- Everyone who is not exempt must wear a face covering at all times, but this should not lead to a relaxation of distancing.
- Thorough cleaning should be done after each and every use of the building.

Most churches (including St Mary's) are choosing to remain closed at this time to support the government's *Stay at Home* message.

CAMPAIGN 2023 LAUNCHED

A campaign has been launched to raise £3million to safeguard the future of



St Mary's ahead of its 900th anniversary in 2023. Campaign 2023 aims to raise £2million to fund urgent repairs to the landmark tower to avoid its closure, and a further £1million to build an endowment fund to ensure the fabric, music and ministry of St Mary's for the next millennium. FABRIC UPDATE

Despite the cold weather, work has continued apace on the roofs of the north entrance and chapter house. Investigations have revealed major

issues with the construction of the roof above the song school stairs leading to significant problems with condensation. The roof now has to be removed and reconstructed at an additional cost of £36,000, taking the project cost to a total of over £170,000. Thankfully, we are highly optimistic of an extension to our existing Culture Recovery Fund Major Works Fund grant to cover 80% of the total. We are obliged to fund the remaining 20%.



Our Operations Manager has been in frequent contact with the Cathedral and Church Buildings Division of the CofE about the grant, and is immensely grateful for their administrative support.

The erection of the tower scaffolding awaits clearance from Warwickshire County Council regarding road closures, an issue which is proving to be hard to resolve, given the narrowness of the road and Warwick's convoluted one-way systems. In the meantime, the Public Notice of the restoration work on the tower has been published - a legal requirement before the Chancellor of the diocese may grant the faculty to allow the works to take place. Daily Hope is a free national phone line which offers music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England at the end of a telephone line. The line is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044. Callers will hear a special greeting from the Archbishop before being able to choose from a range of options, including hymns, prayers, reflections and advice on COVID-19. A section called Hymn Line offers callers a small selection of hymns, updated daily. An option entitled 'Hymns We Love' provides a hymn and reflection."

- *Morning Prayer* Offered by Coventry Cathedral and is open to all.




- *Dial a service* For those without computer access, this gives the opportunity to hear a prayer, hymn and thought for the week.

FAIR TAX SEMINAR

It is organised by The Justice & Peace Group of Warwick Roman Catholics (St Mary Immaculate & St Charles Borromeo), along with the Elders of Warwick Quakers.

With an estimated £7bn of corporation tax receipts still going astray as a result of profit shifting alone, this session will explore how we can stand up for fair tax conduct. Over 60 UK businesses and 9 local councils support this growing movement.
