WELCOME TO OUR WEEKLY NEWSLETTER. The Westminster government has reached Step 4 of its roadmap to move England out of its latest lockdown. This final phase removes all legal restrictions previously in place. Nevertheless we are proceeding cautiously with the reopening of St Mary's. During July and August we will continue with a weekly



10.30am Sunday service, which is also live-streamed on Facebook and then uploaded to YouTube.



We are following the guidance of the Church of England and other organizations. Therefore we are recommending the continued use of masks and hand sanitiser in our building. We have zones on the south and north side of church which are kept for those who also wish to maintain social distancing.

Orders of service, our news sheet, prayer diary and parish magazine, can still be viewed and downloaded from our website. Holy Communion is offered in two kinds (bread and wine) but it is perfectly acceptable to continue to receive in one kind only.



WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND?

Last Monday the Westminster government completed the move from Step 3 to Step 4 of its pandemic road map. Although restrictions have been lifted legally, given the sharp rise in cases of the Delta variant many organizations such as transport and shops are still encouraging users to wear masks and continue to take other hygiene precautions. WHAT IS HAPPENING AT ST MARY'S?

First, we are continuing to recommend that worshipers wear masks for all services. Second, we will be following the Church of England's advice carefully, in particular the practical steps outlined in its detailed guidance. To this end, we will be:

- i) Continuing with online worship provision, in addition to inperson services.
- ii) Continuing to provide alternative means of accessing orders of service for those who may still feel unsure about using shared materials.
- iii) Introducing 'Zoning' spaces for services in our nave. For those who wish to continue to socially distance we are setting aside the seating on the south and north side. Masks must also be worn in these areas.
- iv) Continuing to provide hand sanitiser at entrances and key points.
- v) We will be cautiously re-introducing some other aspects of our worship. For instance, this Sunday we will be singing a congregational hymn for the first time this year. At next Sunday's 10.30am Holy Communion we will have a chalice available for those who wish to take wine, whilst those who would prefer to continue to just have a wafer or a blessing are perfectly at liberty to do so. Having said all that, we will continue our aim of keeping worship in church on the shorter side as a COVID precaution.

WHAT WILL BE HAPPENING AT ST MARY'S?

We are presently entering the summer season and will be continuing with our pattern of a single Sunday Worship service for all during the rest of July

and August. However, we are looking at how we can safely restore more of our regular services from the start of September and further details will be made available through our newsletter and online in the coming weeks. We need to bear in mind that as we move into this stage, we'll be reliant on the



good will and hard work of our dedicated volunteers. COVID 19 has had a major impact on church finances so our worship verging team are working on an unpaid basis. We are presently unable to re-open our shop and although we're re-opening for visitors that's only for this summer period.

NEW BEGINNINGS

It has been great to reopen St Mary's to the public this past week. We'll remain open during the summer months on Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays



and Sundays for the afternoons. Many thanks to our new Visitor Team of Anaïs Vanian-Cooper, Martin Carpenter and Fred Whibley. Our opening hours are 12pm to 5pm every Thursday to Sunday until September 26th. We will be busy returning the church to a more normal setup at the start of the week, but sadly we have concluded that it

will not be possible to open the shop during this 10-week period.

TOWER UPDATE

The first phase of the tower project - protective scaffolding on the lower half of the tower - has moved a big step closer, with public notice of the planned road closures. Our Operations Manager has been working with the County, District and Town Councils, as well as the Chamber of Trade and CJ's Events, to ensure that disruption to the town centre will be kept to the minimum possible, and is pleased to report that all of the stakeholders have been extremely supportive. The work will start no earlier than mid-August (date TBC). For more information, see our website. The OM will communicate more about access to the church as the date approaches.


