Sun I Fifth Sunday after Trinity	We pray for our Curate Alycia as she is ordained Priest at Coventry Cathedral. Fill her with your Holy Spirit, that each day she will trust you to equip her to fulfil her vocation and minister to your people as an instrument of your peace and love. We also pray for Oliver on his baptism day, that he will grow up to know you as his friend, his saviour and his Lord.
Mon 2	Please bless Transforming Communities Together Warwick's efforts to raise £100K for a Youth Bus Project, which will enable a team of detached youth workers to go into areas with little or no youth provision with a bus specially designed to engage hard to reach young people. We place into your hands the funding application currently under consideration.
Tue 3 St Thomas the Apostle	We thank you that Thomas was brave enough to express his doubts fully and that Jesus answered them completely. We pray for all whose journey is suspended by doubt. Please enable them to bring their uncertainties out of the silence, and allow Jesus to bring them to belief that they may continue in the way.

We rejoice in its successes, and mourn its failures. May the celebrations successfully highlight ways for people to support this vital service and help safeguard its future.
Sat 7	We pray for Cherry and Adrian, Chloe and Luke on the day of their weddings. Bless their marriages, that rooted in you and supported by friends their love may be life-affirming and lifelong.

Sixth Sunday after Trinity

Fri 20

As many schools break up for the summer, we give thanks for the academic year that is ending, for all the experiences and learning shared. Bless teachers and students in their rest, that they may return in the autumn ready to re-engage with energy and enthusiasm. Protect the families for whom the holidays bring additional pressure on relationships, time or finances.

Sat 21

We commit into your safekeeping the physical and spiritual journeys of all who are travelling this summer: May the road rise up to meet them... May the wind be always at their back... May the sun shine warm upon their face... The rains fall soft upon their fields... Hold them safe in the palm of your hand...

Sun 22

Eighth Sunday after Trinity
