**Sat 1**

We pray for all young people whose plans have been upended by disappointing exam results. Calm their turmoil and help them discern a bigger picture. Guide them as they consider their next steps, and draw them to trust their future to you, the way, the truth and the life, even if they do not yet know you by name. Sustain parents, counsellors, staff at educational institutions and employment agencies, and all who want to offer them support.

Heavenly Father, help us to be quick to listen today, slow to speak, and even slower to be angry. Reveal to us all in us that is not worthy, that we may rid ourselves of it and welcome with meekness your implanted word that has the power to save our souls. **Thu 20**

We pray with gratitude for our sidespeople, who generously offer themselves and their time to their duties, especially in serving and representing you and your whole church as they welcome people to services and do all they can to put them at ease. Bless them as they meet tonight to plan the busy season ahead, and service by service as they fulfil their vital role.

On **World Alzheimer's Day** we give thanks for the 75,500+ people regionally who have signed up to Alzheimer's Society's **Dementia Friends** initiative, finding out more about how dementia affects a person. At the start of the Tree Council's **Seed Gathering Season**, we give thanks for the perennial joy to be found in picking up a perfect conker. May the project inspire people to plant the trees of the future and delight in seeing them grow. We also ask you to bless all taking part in today's **Warwick Scarecrow Festival**.

**Mon 24**

As **National Eye Health Week** begins we pray that the campaign will increase public awareness about the importance of eye health and regular sight tests in preventing avoidable sight loss.

**Tue 25**

We pray for all who have responsibility for the prison system, from justice ministers to individual officers on the wing, and we ask you to strengthen all who work for prison reform. Grant them the resources, skills and support they need to create prisons that are safer, more secure and more decent, and that will support prisoners to turn their back on crime for good. Locally, we pray especially for HMP Birmingham.

**Wed 26**

In **British Food Fortnight**, we give thanks for UK food growers and producers and remember countries where food is scarce.

**Thu 27**

We pray for St Mary's Bible Study group members starting a new study path tonight with a read-through of Mark's Gospel. Show them fresh perspectives as they see Jesus' life and teaching unfold in context. May all who come feel safe to ask questions, express doubts, share insights, agree and disagree as they explore together what it means to be Christ's disciples here and now.

**Fri 28**

'If ye love me, keep my commandments.' (*John 14.15*) As we prepare to thank you for the food that so many of us have in abundance, we remember all those facing food insecurity. We pray for the individuals and families who are struggling to make ends meet each week and are using food banks. May they be met with kindness and practical help and leave with a sense of dignity restored. Grant wisdom and provision to our **food banks**, that they always have enough of both to meet the demand.

Everlasting God, you have ordained and constituted the ministries of angels and mortals in a wonderful order: grant that as your holy angels always serve you in heaven, so, at your command, they may help and defend us on earth.
