Living Lord, bless all attending this afternoon's Community Celebration event at Woodloes, organised by **Transforming Communities Together Warwick** with Warwick District Council. May residents enjoy the hospitality and activities at the pop-up café and feel encouraged to share their views and experience of local needs. We pray for those gathering this information, that you will guide their actions according to your purpose.

We pray for everyone involved in and attending the **Warwick Words History Festival** this week. Mon 22

We pray for people who experience difficulty with speech – in forming sounds, calling the right words to mind, or fluently delivering them. Comfort all whose speech challenges cause them distress, with the reassurance that you hear and understand the words and thoughts of all.

Tue 23

We bring before you today all who live and work in Antelope Gardens, Saltisford Gardens, St Michael's Road, Birmingham Road, Welton Road and Rothwell Road. As our minds travel down these roads in prayer, we ask you to bless each person, removing any obstacles and drawing them ever closer to you.

Wed 24

On **World Polio Day** we give thanks for more than 20,000 World Health Organisation staff tirelessly vaccinating and monitoring to eradicate polio. Strengthen especially those at work in districts where new cases are still reported. Bless the efforts of all organisations and individuals raising funds for the programme. Locally we pray for **Warwick Rotary Club**.

Thu 25

Be still and know that I am God. (Ps 46.10) Quiet our minds and bodies as we take time today simply to rest in your presence.

Fri 26

Today we ask you to guide all those involved in the ongoing discussions concerning electoral boundary changes, granting them objectivity and impartiality. Sustain those most affected by the outcome. We pray for the coming of your Kingdom with no borders, boundaries or divisions, where you rule by justice and fairness, with love and faithfulness leading the way.

Sat 27

We give thanks for the involvement of the owners of Apple Tree Tea Rooms with the **Toilet Twinning** initiative. May their example encourage other local people, businesses and organisations to twin their toilets, and so help to provide sanitary and safe conditions for those in poverty. We pray too for St Mary's Breakfast Fellowship, celebrating its third anniversary. Bless their efforts to support and encourage each other in faith, friendship and witness in your name.

Sun 28

On the 100th Anniversary of the founding of Czechoslovakia we give thanks for the dedication of the Friends of the Czechoslovakian Memorial Fountain in Jephson Gardens in raising funds for its renovation, and for the generosity of all who have contributed. May the restored fountain be an inspiring and thought-provoking tribute to the 4,000 Free Czechoslovak Army soldiers stationed in Leamington during the Second World War and to their support of resistance movements.

Mon 29

As darkness now falls more noticeably earlier each day, we pray for all who are affected by the lack of light. Sustain them in the months ahead with the reassurance that spring will return.

Tue 30

We give thanks today for the living faith of the **CMM Sisters** in Tanzania and Zambia. May they pass on the love of Jesus to all the disadvantaged people they come into contact with, that people may see the hand of Christ in their own work and life.

Wed 31

Before the ending of the day, Creator of the world, we pray, that with thy wonted favour thou wouldst be our guard and keeper now. From all ill dreams defend our eyes, from nightly fears and fantasies; tread under foot our ghostly foe, that no pollution we may know. O Father, that we ask be done, through Jesus Christ thine only Son, who, with the Holy Ghost and thee, doth live and reign eternally. Amen.
