On international epilepsy awareness day we pray for people who have epilepsy, and their families and friends who are involved, asking you to renew their confidence daily as they live with the condition, and to strengthen their wider support network. Bless all **Purple Day** events, that they may raise funds to help people, especially children and their families, come to terms with their diagnoses. May they also raise awareness among the general public of **what to do** when someone has a seizure, replacing inadequate or inappropriate action with well-informed support.

Wed 27

Abba, Father, we thank you for the Lord's Prayer. Engrave its pattern on our hearts and minds, lest through limiting ourselves to shopping-list prayers we miss both the point, and you.

Thu 28

With the **CMM Sisters** in Tanzania, we ask for your blessing on our Lent appeal to raise funds to provide their Girls' Hostel in Masasi with a solar fridge, spare panel and battery, to keep the evening milk from their cow fresh for sale the following morning. We pray for the girls from surrounding villages whose upkeep the income from milk sales helps to fund, and we give thanks for the hostel that offers them a place to live in safety while they attend secondary school in the town.

Fri 29

Whatever this day may or may not bring, we pray for your love and healing wherever it is needed. O Lord, grant us the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, courage to change the things we can, and wisdom to know the difference.

Sat 30

As they meet for their AGM, we give thanks for our Flower Team, who faithfully share their time and artistry to adorn the church for your glory. Bless them as they serve you and minister to us, reflecting to all the beauty of the changing seasons, the rhythms of the church year and the rites of passage of people's lives.
