We give thanks too that cyclone Kenneth's change of direction spared the Motherhouse in Masasi and pray with the sisters for the relief of the poor people in north Mozambique who suffered much damage from its revised route, barely a few weeks after a battering from cyclone Idai.
Fri 28	We pray for the volunteers of the Warwickshire & Solihull Blood Bikes charity, who deliver essential medical products out of hours to local hospitals. We give thanks for the 7000 calls completed since their founding in 2012. Comfort and guide them as they carefully consider their future after recently losing their contract with the local health authority.
