Tue I

God of refuge, we pray for people experiencing domestic abuse, especially those who feel trapped, with no one to turn to. Hear their prayers, give them hope and bring each the support they need. Bless tonight's performance of *Rock and A Hard Place* at Warwick Quaker Meeting House. As the play highlights the complex nature of domestic abuse and the implications of funding cuts, may it help people respond to those in need in our own community, while raising funds for a local Women's refuge.

Wed 2

We pray for all trying to give up a behaviour that has become a harmful habit. Help them focus on the benefits that change will bring, and strengthen their resolve day by day, that they may resist temptation and overcome any setbacks. May they find that you make a straight path for those who trust in you.

Thur 3

Following August's 50th anniversary of Operation Banner, we pray for our veterans (over 300,000 of them) who served in Northern Ireland during the Troubles, remembering the 1441 Armed Forces personnel who died as a result of operations there and paramilitary actions in other countries. Three-in-one God, bless the ministry and mission of Churches Together in Warwick. As we unite our prayers today with those offered at this month's Prayer Breakfast (at St Michael's, Budbrooke) we pray you will continue to encourage, shape and grow the community of all who pray in Warwick, that as we work together, guided by you, each person and institution in our town, and many beyond, may be supported through prayer.
