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Wed I Naming and Circumcision of Jesus	Lord of all, as our thoughts are drawn to fresh starts and new beginnings, we thank you that in your immeasurable love you give us the ultimate new life in you through Jesus. Help us to see your priorities for our lives, that, sustained and strengthened by the rhythm of prayer and worship, we may love and serve you.
Thu 2	We pray for all attending today's craft and activity morning on the theme of The Wise Men at Radford Road Church . Continue to richly bless these termly community outreach events, that children and families from a wide variety of backgrounds can enjoy meeting each other, making new friends, and learning about Jesus and your love for all.
Fri 3	Bless all who live, work, and worship you in Old Square, Market Place, Market Street, New Street, Swan Street and Brook Street. Strengthen the sense of community engendered by everyday encounters in these places, that through giving and receiving of loving service people in Warwick may experience your love. As wintry weather makes paths and pavements slippery underfoot, we pray for people's safety out and about as well as at home.
Sat 4	As the pantomime and skating season nears its end, we thank you for the good times folk have enjoyed with family and friends, relationships strengthened and precious memories made. We remember all whose experiences were less positive, praying for reconciliation and healing where these are needed. As we dismantle decorations and recycle cards, keep the joy of the Christmas message, and promises of contact made, alive in our hearts.

Lord lesus, as we reflect on the offerings of the wise ones of

old, show us how we can worship you as God and honour you as King today. Guide us as we meditate on the meaning of the

myrrh in your story, and the part is has to play in our own.

Mon 6 The Epiphany	As the Big Schools Birdwatch gets under way we pray that all children may be encouraged to engage with local wildlife, learn about it, protect it and share the pleasure with others.
Tue 7	We give thanks for Fisher House , which provides homely accommodation for the families of service personnel receiving treatment at the QE. Bless staff, patients and their families. We pray especially for those with serious injuries who are affected by treatment provision disagreements between the MOD and the NHS. Thank you for the efforts of pupils from North Leamington School, the Southam Air Cadets and others who raised funds recently for Fisher House by a sponsored swim.
Wed 8	80 years after the British Government introduced temporary food rationing, we reflect on the variety and quantity of food available today. Forgive us when we take our food for granted and help us end food inequality – locally, nationally and globally.
Thu 9	Alongside all who are in prison at this time we pray: Holy God of all creation, you see inside each one of us, knowing us better than we know ourselves. You see the hurt and harm, the brokenness and sin. You know the truth about our past and our present, all that traps and imprisons us. Unlock our hearts to let Christ in, so that his love and strength can help overcome all that imprisons us, and lead us to the freedom he promised in life, in death and in eternity. Holy God, set us free. Amen.
Fri 10	We thank you for the work of Helping Hands . With the team at the Gateway Café , we ask you to bless all involved in today's Telling Stories event. May the testimonies shared help promote the work of the charity, giving hope and help to those in need.
Sat II	As Mothercare prepares to close its stores, we pray for the 2,500 people who will lose their jobs as a result. Locally, we lift up all affected by the closure of the Leamington branch. Reassure them with a sense of your presence as they face their future.
Sun I 2 The Baptism of Christ	Lord, we give thanks for Zaidi Ya Dreams Children's Family in Kenya, and pray for its work providing abandoned, abused and neglected children with a safe and loving environment with the support they need to flourish. May today's Outward Giving Collection help them make a vital difference to these children .
Mon 13	We remember all who find themselves disadvantaged by the requirements of an increasingly digitally oriented world. We pray for members of the recently dissolved Warwick Daytime WI, giving thanks for 25 years of fun and fulfilment their activities have brought. Comfort all who miss their monthly meetings.
Tue 14	We pray for all who live with eating disorders, that they may receive the support and treatment they need. We give thanks for Warwick Hospital's Aspen Centre, and pray for patients, staff and families, especially those who have to travel far for specialist care.

As we pray the Lord's Prayer today – lead us not into temptation – show us how our current experiences might test our faith... Lord, you know us through and through: strengthen us, we pray.

In the power of the Holy Spirit, we ask this in the name of Your Son, who gives His life that we might live. Amen.

God of the orphan, the widow and the stranger, instil in our hearts **Thu 23** a deep sense of hospitality. We pray that when You ask us to feed You, to clothe You and to visit You those with ears to hear, listen, those with eyes to see, look. May our churches participate in the ending of hunger, thirst and isolation and in overcoming barriers that prevent the welcoming of all people. We ask this in the name of Your Son, lesus, who is present in the least of our sisters and brothers. Amen. Almighty God, we turn to You with repentant hearts. In our Fri 24 sincere quest for Your truth, purify us from our unjust opinions of others and lead the churches to grow in communion. Help us

let go of our fears, and so better understand each other and the stranger in our midst, and dare to love the rejected. We ask this in the name of the Just One, Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

God, giver of life, we thank You for the gift of Your compassionate **Sat 25** love which soothes and strengthens us. We pray that our churches may be always open to receive Your gifts from one Conversion another. Grant us a spirit of generosity to all as we journey of Paul together in the path of Christian unity. We ask this in the name of Your Son who reigns with You and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

50 years after Simon and Garfunkel released 'Bridge Over Troubled **Sun 26** Water' we pray that (perhaps even through this Prayer Diary) we can all play a part in building bridges in our churches, families, Third Sunday the community and the wider world. Hasten the day when there after Epiphany are no divisions, but a people united in your mind and purpose.

Loving God, we pray with heavy hearts, remembering the six **Mon 27** million lewish souls murdered during the Holocaust, and millions from other groups slaughtered under Nazi persecution and Prayer (abridged) by ++Justin, Chief genocides which followed. Forgive us when we give space to Rabbi Ephraim fear, negativity and hatred of others, because they are different Mirvis and Senior from us. Through our prayers and actions, help us stand together Imam Qari Asim with those who are suffering, that love will prevail over hate. Amen.

With the CMM Sisters in Tanzania, we pray for the orphans and **Tue 28** clergy widows they support in the surrounding area, and give thanks that the love the Sisters share shows the women and children that they are not forgotten. We remember especially teenagers in their care who have lost several family members. We remember with gratitude all who serve on church PCCs

with your vision, guide their discussions and direct their decisions. We pray for young carers. Bless the Carers Trust Count Me In! **Thu 30** campaign, calling on education providers to do more to identify
