Wed I South Sudan Angola	Give confidence and courage, O Lord, to all those who have given up hope during lockdown and are too frightened to go out. Increase our awareness of others' needs that we may offer appropriate support, whether sitting or walking outside with them, going on a bus together or accompanying them to the shops.
Thu 2 Mongolia Montenegro	As more shops and services reopen we pray that they will be supported in safety by local people and we remember the owners and staff of places that will not be reopening for what- ever reason. After these months of retail restriction, guide us, Lord, as we prayerfully choose what to buy and where to buy it.
Fri 3 St Thomas, Apostle Suriname Gambia	Lord, on the feast of St Thomas the Apostle, we thank you that we can bring before you our honest doubts. Reassure us in the knowledge that the opposite of faith is not doubt, but certainty, because faith must grow and change. Guide and shape us, Lord, so that with a refined and renewed vocation we too want to fall to our knees and proclaim, 'My Lord and my God'.
Sat 4 St Martin Turks and Caicos Lesotho Namibia	As this much-anticipated date arrives, we pray for the next phase of restriction easing. May consideration for others outweigh self-interest as people decide where to go and what to do, to tread as best as possible the narrow line between protecting physical and economic health. Lord Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Life, guide all who follow you, and draw others onto your path.
Sun 5 The Fourth Sunday after Trinity Seychelles USA	Lord, we thank you for the many ways you have inspired churches to respond to the challenges of lockdown and ask for wisdom in the complex whats, hows and whens of reopening buildings for prayer and worship Greet with gladness those who come to you today with joy, in churches, online or in private prayer, and receive with compassion all who come weary, and carrying heavy burdens – give them rest. We pray for all attending socially distanced Sunday Worship At St Mary's in person or from afar.

Mon 6	Heavenly Father, you did not create people to be alone, and we give thanks that those who have been isolated may now form a support bubble with others. Bless and protect all who do so.
Tue 7 Brazil Russia India Spain	Lord, we give thanks for advances in technology that enable so much to be done by so many from so far, and for all who have been able to continue their work or education during isolation. We remember those who are disadvantaged by inequalities in access to technology: children who haven't been able to keep up with their studies because they don't have a computer and adults who have struggled to get online to work from home.
Wed 8 Peru Chile Italy	As our VE75 commemorations continue, we remember the war brides who came over to this country after the war, or went from the UK to live abroad. We celebrate the fulfilling lives enjoyed by many, and we reflect on the experiences of spouses who were greeted in their new countries by hostility and mistrust. Bless all who were war brides or in whose story war brides play an important part.
Thu 9 Iran	We thank you for the Warwickshire 4x4 Volunteer Drivers Group , who have been conveying staff and patients between hospitals, as well as transporting protective equipment. Please bless them as they contribute to the local response to C-19.
Fri 10 Mexico Pakistan	We give thanks for the Cleft Palate and Hair Lip Association (Sunday's planned Outward Giving charity at St Mary's), working to support, connect and empower everyone affected by cleft in the UK. As they vow to continue operating for as long as funds allow, please bless their fundraising and help secure their future.
Sat II Turkey Germany Saudi Arabia	As government guidance concerning weddings and blessings evolves, we continue to pray for couples and their families. May their love be strengthened and trust deepened as they consider plans and review expectations. At St Mary's we remember Joe and Mayuri whose marriage blessing was to have taken place today, and Megan and Maxwell who had planned to marry later this month.
Sun 12 The Fifth Sunday after Trinity France	On Sea Sunday we pray for the hundreds of seafarers stranded aboard ships around the world's coastlines, unable to leave their ships because of Covid-19. Sustain them and their loved ones in this prolonged period of uncertainty. Bless the Flying Angel Campaign launched by The Mission for Seafarers , offering technical support, an advocacy service and chaplains to talk to, and preparing safe centres for when the seafarers can come ashore.
Mon I3	Lord of Creation, we give thanks for animals and all who look after them, remembering especially today SPEAR , a local charity that looks after horses, ponies and rescued animals.
Tue 14 South Africa	We pray for members of Radford Road Church and give thanks for their Add a Ribbon project to remind the community that the church is there for everyone. Bless all who tie a ribbon to the railings to remember people or leave a prayer. Lord, hear them.

Wed 15 Bangladesh	Loving God, we pray today for people of all ages who have a difficult relationship with food, remembering especially those whose condition has been exacerbated by lockdown. Sustain them and their families and bring them the help they need.
Thu 16 Canada Qatar	As the official end of term approaches after the most challenging school year for a generation we pray for children, young people, teachers and support staff 'breaking up' for the holidays. May they all find time for rest and refreshment. Bless and strengthen those who will struggle this summer, financially, logistically and emotionally.
Fri 17 Colombia China Egypt Sweden	On this World Day of Social Justice help us pray boldly, with one voice, for your Kingdom to come. Lord, all things come from you, held by us in trust, not owned. Help us recognise our privilege and use our influence to turn the world turtle in your name, making the last first, listening out for voices that struggle to be heard, and removing support from those who would prosper at others' expense. And, Lord, have mercy on us
Sat 18 Belarus Belgium	We pray for all who are planning to visit Warwick Cemetery tomorrow afternoon to spend socially distanced time in Thanksgiving and Remembrance for a loved one who has died. Bless Fr Stewart as he speaks your words of comfort. May your presence create a place of healing and solace beneath the trees.
Sun 19 The Sixth Sunday after Trinity Argentina	Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, 'Surely the LORD is in this place – and I did not know it!' (<i>Genesis 28.16</i>) Lord, we thank you that you can be worshipped wherever people meet in your name. Today we pray for all at Coffee Shop Sunday , who gather to meet you 'in an ordinary place' (at Costa on Gallagher Retail Park and currently online). Bless all who give and receive care there, that it may be a place of hope and peace. We remember with gratitude the many nurses and healthcare workers from diverse backgrounds and from different countries who make up our NHS and pray they receive due recognition.
Tue 21 Iraq	We pray for all who have lost money postponing or cancelling holidays, flights and theatre trips or rearranging weddings. May matters be resolved in the near future to relieve the extra stress of not knowing. Guide those making decisions involving payment for future bookings that may or may not be fulfilled.
Wed 22 Mary Magdalene Kuwait Singapore	Living God, we give thanks for Mary Magdalene, as the first witness of the Resurrection and for her central role in the foundation of the Church. With the same depth of love that could not bear the separation when they crucified her Lord, we pray that, in the depth of our darkness and sorrows, we too will see Jesus coming to meet us and hear our name being called.

Thu 23 Ukraine Portugal	Master Carpenter of Nazareth, we pray for all who are looking for work at this time; those who have lost jobs due to Covid-19, and those seeking to move from education to employment. Grant them hope, patience and courage. Draw them close to you and help them to entrust their future to your hands.
Fri 24	Holy Spirit, breathe life into our prayers as we meditate on the theme of 24/7 Guide our praise, confession, thanks and pleas.
Sat 25 Oman Philippines	As daily life continues under the shadow of the coronavirus, we pray for all who live and work in Wathen Road, Wedgnock Green, Newburgh Crescent, Percy Road, Tatnall Grove and Peel Road. May they be drawn by your love and seek your presence.
Sun 26 The Seventh Sunday after Trinity	With all who work at Helping Hands we pray for the continued success of the rough sleepers project as the charity works to furnish more permanent properties where rough sleepers can move to from hotels as lockdown lifts. We pray for the financial resources to furnish these, and for those who will move into them, receiving the hand up they need, not just the handout.

Bless the Sisters as they support efforts of the Anglican Church in Tanzania to protect citizens, visiting villages to teach people about Covid-19, making masks for people and demonstrating social distancing in short services.
