<b>Fri I</b> Vietnam Guatemala Sri Lanka	On the official launch of 'Warwick, a Singing Town', we pray for the success of this innovative project to promote and support singing by everyone for everyone. As Alex Smith talks today about the Legacy of Bomber Command, we remember our local RAF veteran Rusty Waughman, who was a Bomber Command pilot during WWII. Thank you for his years of work with Air Cadets, local schools and the general public, bringing history to life, so future generations will remember with greater insight those who flew through the air on a wing and a prayer.
