




# Weekly Newsletter

# HELP WANTED

## ART IN ST MARY'S

St Mary's will be hosting Charles Walker Hazzard's sculpture the Angel of Dresden during our forthcoming schools' Arts Festival. It has been displayed in Coventry Cathedral as part of the Diocesan Centenary celebrations. The work refers to the bombing of Dresden in the late stages of the Second World War and the figure is an intercessory angel between those still alive amongst the destruction, and the terror raining down from overhead. The neutrality of this work enables us to reflect on the comparable mass bombing of Coventry in Nov 1940. The piece reminds us of the effort to peace and reconciliation Coventry Cathedral has sought with Dresden and to subsequent spheres of conflict since the very end of the Second World War.

## ST MARY'S PCC

The St Mary's Church Council met last Wednesday to receive updates on our finances, fabric and safeguarding; plus reports from ministry committee, Warwick Poppies, Deanery Synod and the Friends of St Mary's Choirs. The PCC also approved the Team Council's plans for how the further funding streams from the King Henry VIII Trust would be utilized.


## REST IN PEACE
