



<u>CATHEDRAL NEWS</u>: In 2010 Coventry Cathedral introduced an admission charge, in response to a difficult financial position. It was never something they were keen to do and always a matter of regret. Last year, conversations at Bishops Council led to a recognition that this extraordinary Cathedral is our greatest mission opportunity - a massive shop window for Jesus, and a chance to draw people through their journey through our space, our art and architecture and our story, into the story of Jesus himself. As a result of partnerships within the Diocese of Coventry, and to mark the visit by the Archbishop of Canterbury, from last weekend we are removing the admission charge to the Cathedral!
