




Weekly Newsletter

Communicant members of any Christian church are welcome to make their communion with us. If you do not wish to receive communion, but would like to receive God's blessing, simply hold this service booklet when you come to the altar rail. If you would like a kneeler please ask a sidesperson.



St Mary's seeks to be an inclusive church and welcoming to people of all ages and backgrounds. We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. And they may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the nave.

If you're a UK tax payer the money you place in the collection can be increased by around 25% if you fill out one of the blue or brown envelopes in the Nave chairs or by the main entrance. This allows us to retrieve the tax you've already paid and put it towards the work of St Mary's.







THE ANNUAL CROQUET MATCH ...



IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

During a recent inspection of our roof we discovered that there is significant damage to the iconic tower of St Mary's. Large sections of the stone work are falling down, possibly presenting public safety issues. This will require us to immediately undertake several important actions. We will need to erect (and fund) protective scaffolding for safety reasons. We will need to implement a communications and PR programme to inform the wider community of the situation. We will need to plan and implement a fundraising programme over the coming years to repair and restore the tower. To this end, we recently had a really helpful meeting with Tim Cox, our Lord Lieutenant, and other supportive parties. Our PCC has been looking at our long term needs to support sustainability. We wish to ensure that this kind of crisis never happens again, by building the resources to carry out an ongoing programme of preventative maintenance on the fabric and to sustain all the other things we do at St Mary's, from our wonderful music programme to welcoming visitors. Whilst the recent development with regard to the tower has implications for our priorities, funding for a sustainable Church remains our long term plan. We will shortly be consulting with local business and political leaders about the situation and about funding. Based on that, we will be developing a strategy for a major new fundraising programme to address the tower and to ensure the financial sustainability of St Mary's. We will be informing you about that in the weeks ahead.

MUSICAL SUMMER

There's a second guest from Solihull on our recital calendar for Friday 19th July. Alex Woodrow was Director of Music at Solihull School until last year, and is now a freelance musician based in the area. As Director of Music at Bradford Cathedral from 2012 until 2016, he was the youngest cathedral organist in the UK. His programme, which begins at 1.15pm and is free to enter with a retiring collection, includes music by Bach, Ireland, Langlais and Mendelssohn.

NORTHGATE/SALTISFORD ROAD IMPROVEMENT SCHEME

The original plan to close Northgate Street for resurfacing over the weekend of 24th-26th August has been revised: this work has been brought forward to Saturday 3rd and Sunday 4th August, and there will be no vehicular access to the Church via Northgate Street for these two days. Further closures of Old Square and Church Street are expected, but access to the Church will still be possible via Northgate Street. 
JOB ADVERT
