St Mary's seeks to be an inclusive church and welcoming to people of all ages and backgrounds. We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. And they may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the Nave.

If you're a UK tax payer the money you place in the collection can be increased by around 25% if you fill out one of the blue or brown envelopes in the Nave chairs or by the main entrance. This allows us to retrieve the tax you've already paid and put it towards the work of St Mary's.



HERITAGE OPEN WEEKEND




GALLIPOLI ASSOCIATION

In the secular, sceptical, post-Christian world of the West, continuing faith in angels is both anomaly and comfort. What are angels? Are they something real, a manifestation of divine concern?
