We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. And they may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user, please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the Nave.

LUNCHTIME RECITALS

Undoubtedly one of the cornerstones of organ music, "Widor's Toccata" has crowned countless weddings and funerals, from those of royalty and nobility at Westminster Abbey to those held in small village churches. It has appeared on recital programmes as a curtain raiser and a finale (and sometimes even as an encore), and it has been used as an organ solo item in concerts all over the world. Ironically, it is least often heard in its intended context, as the last movement of Widor's magnificent Fifth Symphony for organ. Mark Swinton will be offering the chance to hear the complete symphony in his recital on Friday 21st February - coincidentally, Widor's date of birth in 1844. Don't miss it, if you're able to come! The performance starts at 1.15pm and lasts about 40 minutes; as always, admission is free with a retiring collection, which will be in aid of the choir's tour to Poland this summer.

DIARY DATE!


