

#### REMEMBRANCE

The Vicar writes: "Last Sunday's Remembrance Sunday in church was exceptional. It began immediately after the 6am *The Battle's O'er* ceremony at the War Memorial when the piper, Andy Wheeler, came and played further songs

and hymns to well over 200 people in St Mary's. Our annual Service of Remembrance was a most moving occasion and it was a privilege to welcome the Bishop of Warwick as our preacher. Every seat was taken for that service (including the Regimental Chapel), with 120 people standing in church and a further 40 joining in around the main door. Afterwards, Bishop John and our choir processed to the War Memorial for the Act of Remembrance where 40 wreaths were laid in memory of those who have died in conflict. In the evening we had We Will Remember comprising readings and Duruflé's Requiem under the auspices of Warwick Poppies with nearly 400 people in church. Plus over the whole weekend we had had over



6,000 visitors to see the poppy display, which is 20% of our usual annual number of visitors in just three days! So, as Vicar, I would like to record my thanks to: our visitor team; Warwick Poppies; the *We Will Remember* team; the church office; our choirs, vergers, servers, sidespeople, guides and flower team; indeed everyone who made last weekend into something that will never be forgotten."


