

### **UNITY SERVICE TONIGHT**





### ST MARY'S CHURCH/SHOP

Following discussions at St Mary's Standing Committee before Christmas we have decided to experiment with closing the church on Mondays and Tuesdays during January and February. This is not a decision we take lightly and there are several factors involved. First, we face serious challenges in recruiting volunteers: we lost three guides last year and two more are planning to step down, which means our Guiding Team is very stretched. In the same period we lost seven shop volunteers, mostly - sadly - from illness and death. Finding replacements is difficult in a world where, increasingly, many newly-retired folk are looking after grandchildren. Since the changes to reception and shop we're better able to keep track of visitor numbers and we know that in this forthcoming period they are particularly low on Mondays and Tuesdays. (It is no accident that the Lord Leycester Hospital and Warwick Museum also close on Mondays.) The Standing Committee will be reviewing whether or not this has worked in due course. In the meantime, if you have any new, bright ideas for recruitment of volunteers do let us know.
