


TECHNOLOGICAL CHANGES


FLAG OF ST GEORGE ...

WARWICK DISTRICT FOODBANK NEEDS YOUR HELP!

Warwick District Foodbank operates from seven Distribution Centres across



the Warwick, Leamington and Kenilworth communities. During the last 12 months it has distributed emergency food parcels to over 4,250 people, all of whom have experienced some form of recognised crisis and were referred to Foodbank by a statutory or charitable agency. 21% of

Foodbank's clients came from Warwick and of the 372 Foodbank vouchers that were redeemed at the Saltisford Foodbank Centre it resulted in the feeding of 590 adults and 305 children respectively. To aid the work of Foodbank they have recently received some generous gifts from a few different organisations to buy a much needed van. To support the running of the van without draining the charity's resources a new scheme has commenced called Club 50 where Warwick District Foodbank are hoping a minimum of 50 people will club together to each pay £5 a month via direct debit (see poster on the notice board). Can you help? This charity is doing a wonderful work in our town and for only £5 each month you could make a very valuable contribution to this work and without breaking the bank.
