


Justice, Only Justice, you Shall Pursue –



However, rising costs and falling numbers have made it impossible to continue. Happily there are now many other regular events on offer and it is now possible to attend similar meetings in Warwick on almost every day of the week. STANDING COMMITTEE: The PCC's Standing Committee had a long meeting last Thurs with updates on church finances and fabric. As we begin to get a clearer idea of our year-end accounts, our deficit is not as much as budgeted because we have not spent as much on fabric as anticipated. One vital fabric project that will be going ahead in March is the long awaited replacement of our sound system (due to start on 11<sup>th</sup>). One suggestion that's too costly is installing a dishwasher in our kitchen. This has been costed at £2,000 as it requires bespoke carpentry and would also need a faculty from the Diocesan Advisory Committee (DAC).

IN MEMORY: One of the things our PCC and Standing Committee have been working on over the past three years is placing a plaque in memory of The Revd Michael Freeman (a former vicar of St Mary's). After years of debate with the DAC this was finally fixed in the chancel just before Christmas and was dedicated after last Wednesday's service of Holy Communion with Sheila Freeman and other family members in attendance. We remain enormously grateful for Michael's ministry in Warwick and in the wider church.
