St Mary's seeks to be an inclusive church and welcoming to people of all ages and backgrounds. We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. And they may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the Nave.

If you're a UK tax payer the money you place in the collection can be increased by around 25% if you fill out one of the blue or brown envelopes in the Nave chairs or by the main entrance. This allows us to retrieve the tax you've already paid and put it towards the work of St Mary's.







FORTHCOMING ORGAN RECITAL

To avoid clashes with half-term holidays and the Warwick Mop, we're putting the lunchtime recital series on pause, to resume on Friday 8th November with a recital by John Wyatt. Having held various church positions, John is now a freelance organist based in Ely, and will be bringing a programme including Guilmant's grand Sonata No.1 together with lighter fare by Bach, Coates, Yon, and Ximénez. The recital is from 1.15-2.00pm and admission is free with a retiring collection.

TRIANON MUSIC GROUP

Come and join 60 members of Trianon Music Group and the Anglia Singers for their first visit to Warwick at 1pm Fri 1st Nov. Based in Ipswich, Trianon is one of the largest music organisations in the East of England, whilst the Anglia Singers (choir of Anglia Ruskin University) is from the city of Chelmsford. Both perform a number of community-based concerts each year. The concert forms part of a four days visit to the Coventry area with concerts in Coventry and Nuneaton. This year Trianon has been celebrating 60 years of music-making together with sixty years of conducting by one of its founder, Emeritus Professor Chris Green OBE who will be conducting part of today's concert. The programme combines choral and instrumental music with a wide-ranging repertoire — including Karl Jenkins, Will Todd and Trianon's President John Rutter, and ending with "swing" music by George Gershwin. 
