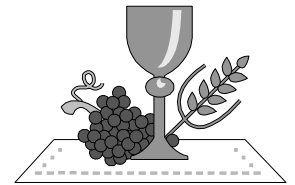




Weekly Newsletter

St Mary's seeks to be an inclusive church and welcoming to people of all ages and backgrounds. We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. And they may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the nave.

If you're a UK tax payer the money you place in the collection can be increased by around 25% if you fill out one of the blue or brown envelopes in the Nave chairs or by the main entrance. This allows us to retrieve the tax you've already paid and put it towards the work of St Mary's.

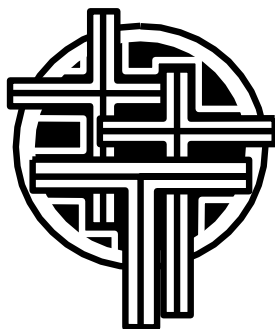

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

During a recent inspection of our roof we discovered that there is significant damage to the iconic tower of St Mary's. Large sections of the stone work are falling down, possibly presenting public safety issues. This will require us to immediately undertake several important actions. We will need to erect (and fund) protective scaffolding for safety reasons. We will need to implement a communications and PR programme to inform the wider community of the situation. We will need to plan and implement a fundraising programme over the coming years to repair and restore the tower. Our PCC has been looking at our long term needs to support sustainability. We wish to ensure that this kind of crisis never happens again, by building the resources to carry out an ongoing programme of preventative maintenance on the fabric and to sustain all the other things we do at St Mary's, from our wonderful music programme to welcoming visitors. Whilst the recent development with regard to the tower has implications for our priorities, funding for a sustainable Church remains our long term plan. We will shortly be consulting with local business and political leaders about the situation and about funding. Based on that, we will be developing a strategy for a major new fundraising programme to address the tower and to ensure the financial sustainability of St Mary's. We will be informing you about that in the weeks ahead.

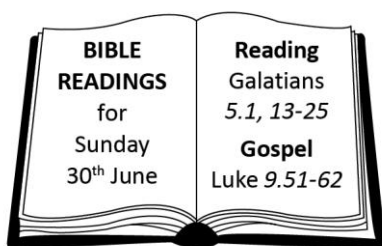

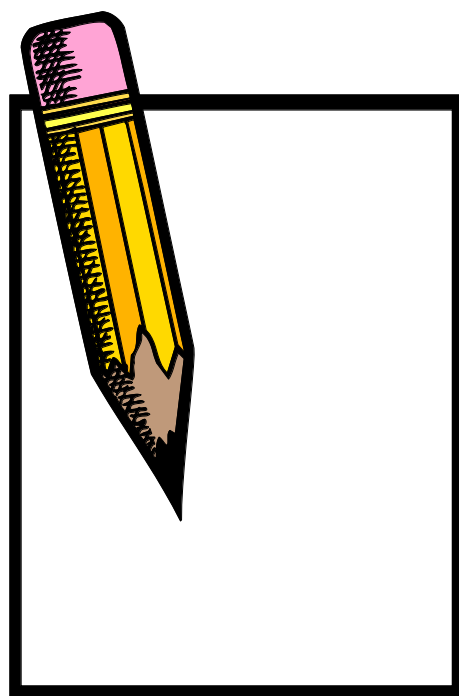
A number of people asked for copies of the vicar’s “One-Bit” sermon on the Trinity from last Sunday so copies are available in church today.

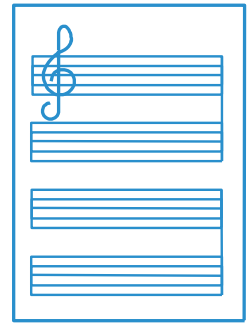
FUNDRAISER FOR ST MARY’S

CHOIR PATRON

We are delighted to announce that soprano Elin Manahan Thomas has agreed to be Patron to the robed choirs at St Mary's. Since releasing her debut album 'Eternal Light' in 2007 with the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment, she has performed at many of the world's most prestigious venues and festivals, and with leading orchestras, choirs (including The Sixteen), and conductors. NORTHGATE/SALTISFORD ROAD IMPROVEMENT SCHEME

On **Monday 24th June 2019** the next phase of the project will commence. Works are planned at the junction of Saltisford, Northgate, and Cape Road into early July, again, this will involve kerbing and paving. In order to deliver the works the mini roundabout at this location will be removed and the following **temporary alterations made to traffic movements:**

- **Saltisford, The Butts, to be made one-way** - southbound travelling away from junction with Saltisford/Theatre Street,
- **'No entry' into Northgate Street from Saltisford**
- **Cape Road is closed for traffic southbound:** Access to County Records Office & Cape Road Car Park will be maintained.
- **The Butts** will be closed to traffic travelling northbound from Castle Street at its junction with Jury Street.
- **Diversions** will be in place for these **temporary measures** and some disruption is expected.

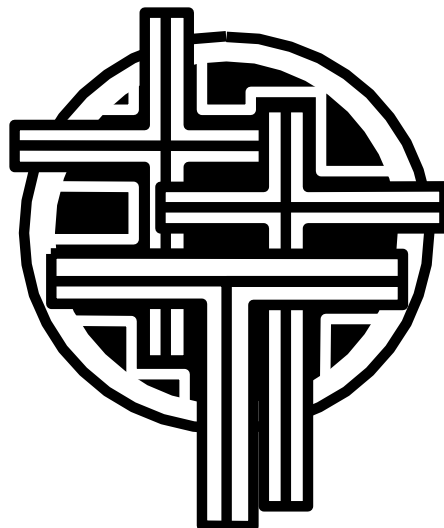
