We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. And they may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user, please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the Nave.



During March he will be taking his final services across the Team in his present role, which will include the 8am and 10.30am services at St Mary's on 8th Mar. There will also be a final celebratory




