WARM THANKS FOR YOUR HELP WITH OUR COOL IDEA: Many thanks to all who contributed to our 'Fridge For Tanzania' appeal during Lent. The final total was £780 which has is being transferred to the CMM Sisters in Masasi. The purchase

of a solar fridge will enable them to store any excess milk produced by the cow we funded two years ago, and sell it at the local market. We are all well aware that, as a Church, we are going through a challenging time at the



moment. However this should not blind us to the fact that, compared with so many in the poorer parts of our world, we are most fortunate. We have access to food, shelter, medical facilities and education - things that the people in Tanzania cannot take for granted. It is by helping to minister to those basic needs that we can, in some small way, respond to Christ's charge to do all we can for the least of his children, for it is by doing so that we are serving him.



## The 6<sup>th</sup> June 2019 marks the 75th Anniversary of D-Day

The Allied invasion of Normandy, and the start of the liberation of Europe. Years of detailed planning led to the largest amphibious assault ever. The Royal Warwickshire Regiment played its part with two battalions of infantry in what is termed the Normandy Campaign. It is fitting that these soldiers should be remembered and there is no better place for this than St Mary's Church. The Regiment is proud that its Association Standards are to be displayed within the Church, at the entrance to the Regimental Chapel for the 6<sup>th</sup> June. In 1963 the Regiment changed its name to the Royal Warwickshire Fusiliers and in 1968 merged into the Royal Regiment of Fusiliers. The Regiment Museum is situate at St John's House, Warwick.


