We have a carpeted area and pew bags available for the youngest members of our congregation, if they wish to use it. They may like to take an adult with them! If you are a wheelchair user, please speak to one of our sidespeople and they will happily move chairs to open up a space for you in the Nave.



CORONAVIRUS: NATIONAL CALL TO PRAYER

In the midst of the Coronavirus pandemic, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and Presidents of CTE are calling all churches to a National Day of Prayer & Action on Sunday 22nd March. They write:

At such a time as this, when so many are fearful and there is great uncertainty, we are reminded of our dependence on our loving Heavenly Father and the future that he holds. At 7pm this Sunday, light a candle in the windows of your homes as a visible symbol of the light of life, Jesus Christ, our source and hope in prayer. We would pray for all in



leadership at this time, making decisions about the containment of the COVID-19 virus, for those working in health and social care, and especially for the most vulnerable, whether elderly or those with underlying health conditions."






LUNCHTIME RECITALS


MARATHON FOR ST MARY'S
