INTRODUCTION & WELCOME

THE CONGREGATION STANDS Officiant O Lord, open our lips and our mouth shall proclaim your praise. All Officiant May Christ the daystar dawn in our hearts All and triumph over the shades of night. *Officiant* In the beginning, when it was very dark, God said:"Let there be light." All And there was light. A sign of light—a candle—is lit on the altar. Officiant In the beginning, when it was very quiet, the Word was with God. All And the Word was God. A sign of the Word—a Bible—is opened on the altar. Officiant When the time was right, God sent his Son. He came among us and was one of us. All Signs of Christ—a chalice and pattern—are placed on the altar.

Opening Canticle (from Psalm 66: 1-7)

Officiant Be joyful in God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; sing the glory of his praise.

Officiant	Bless our God, O you peoples;
All	make the voice of his praise to be heard, Blessed be God, Source of Wisdom, living Word, abiding Spirit, Blessed be God for ever.

Confession and Absolution

Officiant Our Lord Jesus Christ said: The first commandment is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is the only Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. All Amen. Lord, have mercy. Officiant Come, let us return to the Lord and say Lord our God, in our sin we have avoided your call. Our love for you is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes away early. Have mercy on us; deliver us from judgement; bind up our wounds and revive us; in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Officiant The Lord of Creation enrich you with grace, and nourish you with Christ's blessing; the Lord defend you in trouble and keep you from all evil; the Lord accept your prayers, and absolve you from your offences, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. Amen.
